Front Porch Pick Up at Whiting Library - Press Release

The Whiting Library announces Front Porch Pick Up will begin on Wednesday, May 6 from 10 a.m. to 2p.m. Front porch pick up will then be available on Monday, Wednesday, Friday and Saturday from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. or by other arrangements. To support community health, the Whiting Library building is currently closed to the public. Whiting librarians are still providing services to the community despite our closed doors and we are eager to continue to find ways to assist our patrons from a distance. Front porch pick up is a welcome addition to our many online offerings, free books and movies, and kids craft projects.

How Will Front Porch Pick Up Service Work?

- 1. Browse our catalog online. You can find a link to the catalog on the library website: www.whitinglibrary.org
- 2. Place items on hold by calling the library at 875-2277 or emailing whitinglibrary1@gmail.com .
- 3. Remember, there is a ten item check out limit.
- 4. Library staff will ask you for your library card number when you call or email, so be sure to have it with you. If you don't have a library card, let's get you set up over the phone!
- 5. Once your item(s) are available for pick up, you will be notified.
- 6. Once notified, come to the library and pick up the bag with your name on it off the cart on the front porch.
- 7. Please, only one person at a time on the front porch. Only items placed on hold will be available for porch side pickup. There is no interlibrary loan available at this time. Please do not use the pickup service if you are feeling sick in any way. For more details about front porch pick up, visit the library website. While the library is closed, please keep your currently checked out materials at home or feel free to return books to the drop box on the front porch at any time. Due dates will be extended and no overdue fines will be charged during this period. We sure miss all of our patrons while we stay closed to the public due to Vermont's Stay at Home Order. Contact-less front porch pick up of our collection will be a great way to bridge the gap until you can safely return to browse the stacks.



A Message from Title 1 Schoolwide Program Dear Families,

The role of the Title I Schoolwide Program (Title I/SWP) services in Chester Andover Elementary has changed since the implementation of the Distance Learning Plan for Vermont. Both Title I/SWP Reading and Mathematics intervention teachers are focused on developing resources for long distance learning and on being available to classroom teachers to work on adapted assignments. We are available to work with all students on targeted practice and adapted lessons. This will be done via breakout rooms in zoom, as a support to the lessons taught by the classroom teachers. We are also available to provide resources to individual families and teachers for use with students.

We are currently designing a website with a variety of reading, writing and mathematics resources and tools that teachers and parents can access. Please understand that the website is under construction and will be a work in progress. Once the site is published, we will share the website link with classroom teachers and through the "Beating Drum". These resources will directly correspond to the TRSU-identified critical learning concepts that we will be focusing on for the end of the school year.
