• Vermont Principals Association Leadership Conference: Leading For Equity

I attended the conference from 7/29-8/1 and gained a great deal of information regarding implicit bias and equity in the classroom. The Keynote Speaker, Ruha Benjamin explored the relationship between knowledge and power, race and citizenship, health and justice. David Melnick of NFI Vermont presented how we can use metaphors and implicit messages to transform trauma. Kathlene Budge from

Boise State University shared powerful classroom and school-wide strategies to disrupt the effects of poverty on student success.

• TRSU Leadership Retreat 8/6-8/8

Using our TRSU Vision and Continuous School Improvement goals, teachers and administrators worked together to create an action plan for the next five years. We planned our professional development days for continued work on Proficiency-based education, Personal Learning Plans, Early Literacy, Trauma-Informed Practices and Assessment



Literacy. We dove deep into the work of data use and Inquiry Cycles

to improve student outcomes and made plans to implement the use of data both at the classroom level snd with school-wide teams.

Building and Grounds – summer work

The new front entry doors are installed and tinted. New coat hooks have been installed outside of all classrooms. New carpet was in stalled in three classrooms and the exterior of the building has been

painted. During the next few weeks we will install the automatic door openers, magnetic locks and panic button for the new front doors. The white house will have some ceiling repairs and a new roof installed. As next steps we will be looking to change the doors on the outside of the cafeteria as instructed by the fire marshal and upgrading the cameras and monitors at the building entrance. I plan to apply for safety grant funding to provide egress windows in about half of our classrooms.


